This week, teachers in Preschool to Year 2 participated in part two of their very powerful

literacy **professional learning** opportunity, which began in term 1. Ms Christine Tofler, internationally renowned literacy teaching/learning expert, spent Monday in our school working with groups of teachers and the leadership team. Their study focussed on the essential components of high quality literacy teaching and learning. The day was an outstanding opportunity for our staff to reflect deeply on their practice as well as to develop and enhance the strategies they are using to help our children be the best possible learners in literacy. Over the course of this term, we will share some ideas that you may also find useful when working with your children at home.

As you know, our staff has also had the unparalleled chance to work with maths education guru, Anita Chin, this year. Her sessions are always energetic and filled with ideas to challenge and make us re-think approaches to teaching mathematics! If you have not yet registered for the **Parent/Carer maths evening** on 31 May, please do so – you will have a great evening of learning – and your child will be amazed by your maths expertise!

Next week marks the beginning of **NAPLAN** – an Australia wide assessment programme in Literacy and Numeracy. Students in Yr 3, 5, 7 and 9 across the country participate

in the assessment, with reports being provided to parents/carers later in the year. This year is the first year that NAPLAN is undertaken 'on-line' and over a three week period.

Preschool

This term the Preschool Unit of Inquiry focus is all about 'Healthy me!' Following on from our exciting Nutrition Magician performance last term, the Preschool children are engaging in conversations around 'Everyday' and 'Sometimes' foods. Many discussions are being had about different foods we eat, ways we can keep healthy and what we do in our Preschool environment to stay happy, safe and healthy. In the coming weeks we will be learning about 'Glow', 'Grow', and 'Go' foods and their purpose in terms of being healthy.

Across our Learning Groups, there have been similarities in interests, with many Preschoolers engaging in photography sessions. Through these experiences the children are using the iPads to take photos and capturing the learning taking place within our environments.

'The Arts' is another common thread of interest across our Learning Groups with many of the Preschoolers fascinated with music, whether that be with musical instruments or through our music wall in our outdoor learning

environment. The music wall has been a real hit with children banging on pots and pans and making different sounds. Children have been using the painting easels to create artworks using natural materials.



We are excited for Term 2 and the many wonderful explorations and investigations we will be engaging in.

Kindergarten

Children in Kindergarten have dived back into their learning, starting Term 2 with a splash. In Science we have been busy investigating the different types of weather and the specific features of each type of weather. We can't

wait to see what weather we will have here in Canberra this coming winter!

One of the highlights of this week was learning about ANZAC day, and the significance of red poppies and what they represent. Each Learning Group collaboratively created red poppy wreaths to show our respect to our ANZACS during our school assembly.


In Mathematics, we have been learning new strategies for counting; in particular we have been using the 'touch and scoot' method to make our counting more accurate. We have enjoyed experimenting with different concrete materials to assist our learning.

Year 1

Welcome back to Term Two! The Year One children have been revising nouns, verbs and adjectives in English as we begin our new unit on Narratives.

We have been reading one of our favourite books 'The Gruffalo' and discussing the importance of characters within a story.

In Maths we have begun exploring data and recording what our favourite colours are using bar graphs. The children are very excited to be learning all about



animals and their habitats this term in Science. We have been talking about a range of animals and their features, for example, scaly, fur, four legs and so on. We are very much looking forward to a wonderful term of learning!

Year 2

After a well-earned break students are back and ready for a big Term 2. In literacy we will be exploring procedure writing and its different structural components, as well as specific language components such as verbs.

In Maths we will be investigating telling time to both the hour and the half hour as well as the relationship between addition and subtraction.

Our unit of Inquiry we teach us about how technology has changed over the last 100 years. We will be exploring how it has made our lives easier and where technology will be going in the future.

We have also spent time learning about the ANZACs and the sacrifices they made for our country; we were able to pay our respects at our ANZAC ceremony on Wednesday.

Finally, we will be preparing for our Cross Country Carnival on Thursday. We have been training hard every day and can't wait to do our best. Later in the term we also have our school Athletics carnival. We are so excited to have the

students back and can't wait for another fun and exciting term of learning.

Year 4/3

The Year 4/3 students have been very busy during week one of term 2! We have completed our beautiful ANZAC Day inspired artworks to present at the ANZAC Day assembly. We used a combination of line art techniques to create our artworks and they look fantastic! Did you get to see them? Thank you to those families who were able to attend the Assembly and participate in their child's 'living the learning' experience.



We have been practising our running in preparation for the Cross Country carnival being held on Thursday. We are focussing on stamina and

endurance, as the race is long! Some of us will need to complete two or three laps of the oval, while the older students in our year levels will need to run two laps of the oval **and** the school. Don't forget that we can earn house points by cheering on our house members and by participating in the races. Everyone can help!

In Mathematics, we have been identifying the steps needed to solve a range of word problems, including one, two and three step problems! Can you identify and underline the important information in the following word problem?

"In Sarah's classroom there are red chairs, yellow chairs, and blue chairs. There are 8 red chairs. There are 2 times as many yellow chairs as red chairs, and there are 7 fewer blue chairs than yellow chairs. How many chairs are there in Sarah's classroom?"

We are looking forward to a fun and thought filled rest of term 2!

Year 6/5

Learning is well underway. Children are investigating natural disasters, specifically floods and bushfires. These investigations will involve tasks during English, Technology and Geography lessons. The combined learning will lead to the researching and writing of information texts about a selected disaster. Children will then consider the implications, emotional and physical, on individuals and communities and the actions that can be taken to reduce

the impact of natural disasters. As a way of viewing an event from a different point of view and empathising with others, children will prepare and share oral recounts in the first and third person as if they had been involved in the selected disaster.

Science lessons will be all about 'Adaptations'. Children will investigate how animals and plants adapt, to surviving in varying habitats across the world. Children will have the opportunity to select a particular animal which they will then study in greater detail and share with others in their Learning Groups.

During Maths lessons, over a series of activities, children will get the opportunity to collect and record data in various graphs. Data collection will include surveys, observations and tally charts. Different types of graphs, such as pie charts, column and line graphs and digitally generated pictographs will be used to reflect the collected data.

This term promises to be a term filled with fun, effective learning and exciting opportunities for families to join us.

Yr 4/3 Lettuce Learn

As part of our History Unit of Inquiry, Lettuce Learn studied a range of different types of cultural and historical celebrations and commemorations.
