Religious Education

Under the Education Act 2004, Section 29 (1), if the parents of children at a government school ask the Principal for their children to receive religious education in a particular religion, the Principal must ensure that reasonable time is allowed for their children's education in that religion.

As such a request has been received at our school for Christian Education, The Combined Gungahlin Churches will deliver a Christian education session (no more than forty minutes – as per the Education Act) on 5 December. This is suitable for children in the Kindergarten to Year 6 age range. If you wish your child to participate in this session, please complete a permission form which is available from Reception. For organisational reasons, the permission note must be returned to *Reception no later than 9.15am Tuesday 4 December*.

Children's Crossings

Children's crossings are used near schools to provide safe crossing points for students. Please be alert and drive cautiously near the children's crossing on William Cooper Avenue.

Under the [Australian Road Rules](#), drivers are required to stop at a children's crossing if a pedestrian is entering or on the crossing (this includes adults). Vehicles should not proceed until there is no pedestrian on or entering the crossing. More information is available in a [safety and children's crossing information sheet](#).

Creating a safe environment around our school requires a collaborative approach from everyone, including parents, teachers, children and the broader community. A great way to improve safety around the school is to decrease the number of cars on the road, particularly during the peak times. Encouraging children to walk or ride to school will help to reduce congestion and improve safety. It will also provide health benefits for the children.
